

A202CSU - PLACEMENTS IN SCHOOLS: STUDENT TUTORING

MODULE SUMMARY

Through first-hand experiences of teaching, this module offers an introduction to the professional skills necessary to become an effective teacher, emphasizing the significance of evaluation and assessment in the teaching and learning cycle. The role, place and value chosen National Curriculum subject are explored, together with a range of resources and syllabuses. The module stresses the importance of planning and provides you with the opportunity to reflect upon your own experiences in the classroom and identify areas for future develop. Students will be required to complete a minimum of 20 hours tutoring in school; this is a compulsory element of the module.

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

No academic requirements. CRB clearance and Verbal communication, time management, a personal reference from someone who has known you for 2 years or more must have been obtained. Students must have DBS clearance as this is a legal requirement for anyone working with young people under 18 years of age, or vulnerable adults, on a one-to-one basis. Students will need to provide specific information and produce forms of identity to the University to complete this process.
