

# A219CSU- INTERMEDIATE SIGN LANGUAGE SKILLS

## MODULE SUMMARY

This module will teach students British Sign Language at an intermediate level enabling communication beyond the basics provides an introduction to the basics of British Sign Language, giving course participants the opportunity to learn practical communication skills. Workshop sessions will be predominantly based on the active learning on British Sign Language with course participants building their knowledge on a weekly basis. Course participants will consider the different technologies used by those who are deaf or have hearing impairments. They will also consider the recent changes made to Support Services to the deaf community. This module will be of particular interest to students who want to develop skills in British Sign Language, enabling them to communicate to an intermediate level to those who are deaf. It will also develop transferable skills in interpersonal skills; effective communication skills and adaptability.

## ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Only students that have attended the introductory level of this module or have equivalent experience (as assessed by the module leader). Pre-requisite Modules: A104CSU or A109CSU.

## ASSESSMENT

Sign Language Practice (50%) a practical demonstration of 'signing' through the communication with and observation by the course tutor. Reflective Essay (50%): an essay reflecting on 'The changes in support services for the deaf community. The development of the employability skills by the course participant
